Environment Policy Statement

AmplifyChange's vision is the full attainment of Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) for all, including women and girls, young people, and the vulnerable and marginalised. Our mission is to be the global leader in supporting grassroots organisations and building stronger, more inclusive movements for SRHR, especially in challenging contexts.

AmplifyChange is committed to be an environmentally positive organisation contributing to the global goal on climate change, protecting biodiversity in the places we work.

AmplifyChange believes that caring for the environment is inseparable from our work in human health and social equality. We recognise the significant environmental sustainability challenges facing the world today such as the effects of climate change and biodiversity loss.
