### Due Diligence function

AmplifyChange provides grants to civil society organisations based in low and middle income countries in Africa, South Asia and The Middle East. Our grantee partners work on improving **Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR)** for vulnerable and marginalised communities.

AmplifyChange has a bold ambition - to be a global leader in building stronger and more inclusive movements for **SRHR**, by effectively supporting those who are best placed to lead change and amplifying their voices. AmplifyChange puts grassroots organisations at the centre of all we do and we are defined by our values of being **responsive, supportive, forward-thinking, transparent and respectful**. AmplifyChange operates as a challenge fund, and in doing so, we make grants to a wide range of organisations in civil society working in the field of SRHR. Alongside our own commitment to ethical conduct and integrity, we are also obligated to take all reasonable actions in ensuring our funds are granted to organisations who share these values and act in accordance with the principles of our organisation.

AmplifyChange offers four grant types, ranging from our smallest **Opportunity Grants**, supporting civil society organisations working at a local level, to our largest **Partnership Grants**, supporting established groups to strengthen civil society movements and foster the capacity of smaller civil society organisations (CSOs). Funding is available during time-limited application windows announced on our website and socials. We support CSOs located in Africa, South Asia, and the Middle East. <b>Opportunity</b>	To support smaller groups and new entrants to SRHR advocacy. To enable local advocates to address new and emerging priorities. Available to non-registered groups.	142	£60,576
<b>Strengthening</b>	To support more established medium-sized groups, seeking to advocate for SRHR beyond their local communities and in bringing about specific change.	114	£133,342
<b>Network</b>	To support established groups working within or across countries. Supports networks and coalitions, and scale-up of effective advocacy approaches.	24	£512,018
<b>Partnership</b>	To support established groups working to build and strengthen civil society movements. This will encompass the facility to on-grant to smaller local groups and foster their capacity.	4	£1,268,750



AmplifyChange works in many high-risk environments and our grantee partners include small organisations, of limited capacity. The risk profile of our portfolio of grants is high, and as such the mitigation of fiduciary risks associated with grant giving are an essential component of the fund.



In 2023, we nearly doubled our grants expenditure to £8.4 million. In the pipeline for 2024 we have a raft of innovative activities for strengthening our grantee partners, through new funding rounds but also new mechanisms for peer learning, avenues for global dissemination of their expertise, and opportunities for nurturing grantee wellbeing and mutual support.
